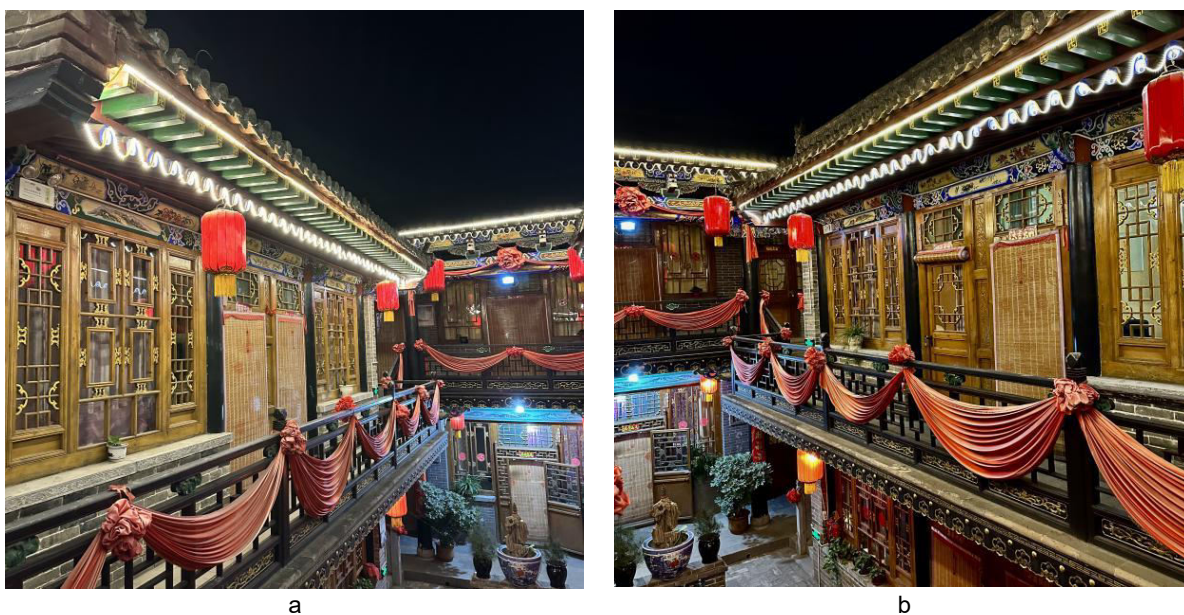


Figure 1. "Traditional Ancient Buildings series" in Ping Yao Ancient City
